

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

I am pleased to report this weekend that our parish has pledged \$17, 827 in funds to the 2010 Annual Catholic Appeal. Thank you to all who have thus far contributed to this annual campaign for our diocese. As I mentioned to you some weeks ago in my bulletin column, 75% of the funds that surpass our parish goal of \$13,128 will be returned to our parish. Using the most recent figures provided to us by the diocese, the rebate that will be returned to us so far is \$3,524.25.

Several months ago, I expressed to you our need to increase the weekly Sunday collection so that we might maintain the budgeted amount for our annual income. At the time, that shortfall was \$8,000 for the current fiscal year. For a number of weeks after bringing this to your attention a noticeable increase was recorded in our weekly offering. We are still monitoring a slight shortfall that will affect our year end projections. Hopefully, we will maintain the increase to the weekly offertory collections until the end of June and encourage those of you who have not yet offered your gift to the Annual Catholic Appeal to do so as soon as possible. I cannot stress enough this critical need for the parish. It would be my hope if we cannot diminish the weekly offertory shortfall already accrued this current fiscal year that the difference might be covered through the Annual Catholic Appeal rebate. Much of that will depend on the number of registered parishioners who contribute to the annual diocesan appeal. If you have not yet pledged a monetary gift to the 2010 Annual Catholic Appeal, I hope you will consider doing so. Envelopes will be available until June in the entryways of the Cathedral and in the Parish Office. A gift to this diocesan-wide campaign at this point in time will not only satisfy the needs of the diocese, but our parish as well. Win-win situations in our national economic climate of late have been few and far between. I would hope that we could experience just that at Rosary Cathedral.

Let me conclude my column this weekend with a message of thanks. I am grateful for the loyalty our parishioners have expressed in the way of their generous giving. Whenever I have invited you to share the financial challenges of our parish, you have responded graciously and with trust. I also need to express thanks to all who have and continue to pray for our mission at Rosary Cathedral. No pastor could ask more from his flock.

May the Triune God fill you with abundant blessings this weekend and in the pending summer days.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are celebrated at Rosary Cathedral on the third Sundays of the month at 12:15 p.m. Parents of first-born children are required to attend a one-hour preparation conference before the baptism. Call the parish office at 419-244-9575 for more information and to register for the conference.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Marriages at Rosary Cathedral are celebrated on Fridays at 5pm or 6pm, Saturdays at 12 noon, 2 pm and 6pm. Engaged couples should contact the parish office a minimum of six months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparation. At least one member of the couple MUST be in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3-3:30 pm in the Cathedral. Communal Reconciliation services are also held during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

HOSPITAL VISITATION:

When admitted to an area hospital, parishioners should contact the Parish Office in order to receive a pastoral visit, the Sacrament of the Sick or Holy Communion.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION:

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is held in the Bishop's Daily Mass Chapel every First Friday of the Month following daily 7 am Mass until 12 noon October to June.
