July 26 – August 1, 2010

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

I can count on my fingers the few times as a priest I have to perform something extremely difficult. Standing before our Sunday congregation last weekend to express that I will be leaving my post as Rector of Rosary Cathedral at the end of August is probably the most difficult for me. Sometimes, priests may not always give the impression that they have feelings and emotions, but let me assure you they do. The responsibility of saying goodbye is even more difficult when a parish community has been most welcoming and cooperative with their pastor. I have never felt anything but support and encouragement from the members of Rosary Cathedral Parish the past seven years.

It is hard to believe that seven years have passed. I can still remember the very nice welcome I received from all of you who were here in July of 2003. Despite the tremendous loss we were all feeling at the time with the death of Bishop James Hoffman and the pending announcement of a new Bishop for the diocese, the parish still continued its good work of worship, service and outreach. Those will be the three strong characteristics unique to Rosary Cathedral Parish I shall always treasure in my heart.

While change evokes a number of unknowns, I am very happy that Father Bill Kubacki will be my successor as Rector. He is a man of great integrity, experience and compassion. He knows much about our parish by way of my breakfast and dinner conversations with him at the Episcopal Residence. He has interacted with our parish from time to time and I have been grateful that he has interacted with us on occasion for weekend and daily Masses and a few parish social events. I have always appreciated his concern for all of you, even though he has plenty to attend to in his work as Vicar for Priests. Now he will have that opportunity to serve as your priest and spiritual leader.

They say that change is the only constant in life. While many good initiatives have taken place these past seven years, the glory days of our beloved Cathedral and parish are yet to be seen and experienced. Your fidelity to that mission and expenditure of time, talent and treasure will be the essential ingredient to our unique legacy. I consider my time with you as a small contribution to the greatness of the Cathedral and the parish that has its spiritual home here.

My reassignment is also time of celebration – to thank God for all of the initiatives undertaken these past seven years and to thank one another for the graces God has given all of us. As was mentioned last weekend, our upcoming annual Parish Picnic on Saturday, August 28, 2010 immediately following the 4PM Mass will provide an opportunity to say thank you and goodbye to the entire parish in my role as Rector. I hope you will be able to join the parish for this event. Please call the Parish Office (419-244-9575) to leave word of the number attending so that we can provide a sufficient amount of food.

Keep me in your prayers, as I do all of you these days of transition.

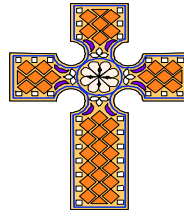

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are celebrated at Rosary Cathedral on the third Sundays of the month at 12:15 p.m. Parents of first-born children are required to attend a one-hour preparation conference before the baptism. Call the parish office at 419-244-9575 for more information and to register for the conference.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Marriages at Rosary Cathedral are celebrated on Fridays at 5pm or 6pm, Saturdays at 12 noon, 2 pm and 6pm. Engaged couples should contact the parish office a minimum of six months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparation. At least one member of the couple MUST be in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3-3:30 pm in the Cathedral. Communal Reconciliation services are also held during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

HOSPITAL VISITATION:

When admitted to an area hospital, parishioners should contact the Parish Office in order to receive a pastoral visit, the Sacrament of the Sick or Holy Communion.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION:

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is held in the Bishop's Daily Mass Chapel every First Friday of the Month following daily 7am Mass until 12 noon October to June.
