

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

Next weekend, April 1 and 2, Father Edward Smith will be coming to Rosary Cathedral to lead us in a Lenten Mission on the topic: "The Wonder of It All – Reflections on A God Who Is Love." Father Smith is presently serving as the President/Rector of the Athenaeum of Ohio/ Mount Saint Mary's Seminary of the West in Cincinnati, Ohio. I have personally known Father Smith for 25 years since college seminary days. He is an accomplished musician (organ and piano) and a very articulate teacher who has a special gift of connecting real life experiences to the most profound theological truth. Before his appointment as the President and Rector at the seminary in 2004, he served as the director of spiritual formation in the seminary division of the Athenaeum of Ohio. He is well-read in the spiritual writings of the Church and understands the challenges encountered by the Christian faithful in this present context of human history.

Father Smith will be presenting three conference talks next weekend. The first conference will be held on Saturday, April 1, 2006 at 10 AM in Monsignor Smith Auditorium and will be concluded by 12 NOON. A second and much shorter conference topic will be incorporated in the homily at all three Sunday Masses at the Cathedral next weekend. The third conference talk will be held on Sunday, April 2, 2006 at 2 PM in Monsignor Smith Auditorium followed by a potluck meal. Participants who attend the Saturday morning conference will indicate on a sign-up sheet the covered dish they will bring for the potluck on Sunday afternoon, or participants who may only be able to come to the conference on Sunday afternoon are asked to bring a covered dish with them. The parish will provide the meat entrée, beverage and table service at the potluck. We are in need of salads, casseroles and desserts.

I hope you will plan to join us next Saturday and Sunday in welcoming Father Edward Smith to Rosary Cathedral for our Lenten Mission. The Catholic faithful from parishes in the Metro Toledo area have also been invited to join us for this event.

May God continue to bless your Lenten observance.

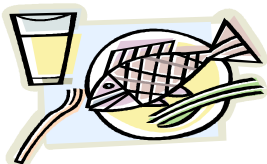

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are celebrated at Rosary Cathedral on the third Sundays of the month at 12:15 p.m. Parents of first-born children are required to attend a one-hour preparation conference before the baptism. Call the parish office at 419-244-9575 for more information and to register for the conference.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Marriages at Rosary Cathedral are celebrated on Fridays at 5pm or 6pm, Saturdays at 10am, 12 noon, and 2pm. Engaged couples should contact the parish office a minimum of six months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparation. At least one member of the couple MUST be in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3-4pm in the Cathedral. Communal Reconciliation services are also held during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

HOSPITAL VISITATION:

When admitted to an area hospital, parishioners should contact the Parish Office in order to receive a pastoral visit, the Sacrament of the Sick, or Holy Communion.
