

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

On this Third Sunday of Easter, Rosary Cathedral will be hosting the annual Neophyte Mass. Bishop Robert Donnelly will be the celebrant at this year's liturgy which will commence at 3PM today. Women, men and children will be coming from the 19 counties of Northwest Ohio to the Mother Church of the Diocese of Toledo. They gather with the Bishop to acknowledge their call to the Catholic faith, and having experienced the sacraments of initiation in the local parish where their faith has been nurtured and sustained the past month or years, they come together at the Cathedral to offer praise and thanksgiving to God.

The Neophyte Mass is a well attended event at the Cathedral. For many of these newly baptized or confirmed persons, this will be their very first visit to the cathedral church of the diocese. We welcome them to this diocesan treasure and pray that their visit will be one of many pilgrimages made to Rosary Cathedral in the future.

I am also reminded this Easter season of the many young people in our local parishes of the diocese who are preparing to or have celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation and First Holy Communion. These initiation sacraments orient us more closely to the Risen Christ and his teaching of love and belonging. At Rosary Cathedral, our parish celebrated Confirmation on March 3, 2007. First Holy Communion will be celebrated at the 9AM Mass on Sunday, May 6, 2007. Please remember in your prayers our Cathedral youth who celebrate these initiation sacraments this year.

Health Information from the Parish Nurse Ministry:
The anti-cancer lifestyle: Maintain a healthy eight and exercise for at least 30 minutes every day. Eat a mostly plant-based diet. Eat five or more servings a day of vegetables and fruits, plus more than seven servings a day of whole grains, beans, and root vegetables. Limit the amount of processed, snack-type foods you eat. Limit red meat to less than three ounces a day. Limit fatty foods, especially those of animal origin. Use modest amounts of vegetable oils in cooking. Cut back on salt (processed foods are especially high in salt). Limit alcohol (no more than two drinks a day for men, no more than one for women). Don't eat charred foods. Limit the amount of grilled meat and fish you eat. Save smoked and cured meats for special occasions. For more information, please contact your primary care physician.

At least one member of the couple MUST be in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3-4pm in the Cathedral. Communal Reconciliation services are also held during the seasons of Advent and Lent.
