

Dear Parishioners and Friends at Rosary Cathedral:

For the next several weeks we will be displaying at the parking lot entrance of the Cathedral the landscape blueprint that will be used to develop the recent property acquisitions around our campus. The overall design of this new arrangement will expand our Cathedral parking capabilities to 200+ spaces for events held on our campus. Several of the key features that you will notice in the site plan include the creation of a new driveway between the Cathedral and school facilities on Collingwood Boulevard, the enclosure of the parking lot with fencing between the Cathedral and school facilities near the parking garages and Episcopal (Bishop's) Residence on the Parkwood driveway (no longer providing access to the parking lot from Parkwood), additional handicapped parking spaces closer to the parking lot entrance of the Cathedral, the expansion of the existing lot on the South side of the school facilities to Delaware Ave, including new lighting and landscaping, as well as a new parking lot on the corner of Collingwood and Melrose. Our new lots will be enclosed by a stone hedge of several feet with wrought iron fencing to match the Romanesque arches of the Cathedral windows and entrances.

New signage identifying Rosary Cathedral will be placed at the corner of Collingwood and Delaware, as well as the new driveway entrance between the Cathedral and school facilities. Both lots will have ample lighting for security during evening services.

This project will likely take most if not all of the summer months this year to complete. I invite you to stop by the display in the Cathedral to view the scope of the project. Do keep it and those who will be working on it this summer in your prayers these next weeks and months.

On a very joyous note this weekend, we congratulate six young people in our Cathedral community who are receiving their First Holy Communion at the 9:00 AM Mass. We express our congratulations to Juan Avad, Maria Connelly, Darion Greer, Deion Greer, Andrew Rymers, and James Rymers, Jr., their families and friends that celebrate this special day. May God always strengthen their love for the Lord and the Holy Eucharist. I also wish to express my personal thanks on behalf of the entire parish to Mary Lou Snyder who prepared them for their First Confession this last fall and Roxanne Gackstetter who prepared them for their First Holy Communion.

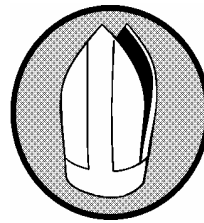

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are celebrated at Rosary Cathedral on the third Sundays of the month at 12:15 p.m. Parents of first-born children are required to attend a one-hour preparation conference before the baptism. Call the parish office at 419-244-9575 for more information and to register for the conference.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Marriages at Rosary Cathedral are celebrated on Fridays at 5pm or 6pm, Saturdays at 10am, 12 noon, and 2pm. Engaged couples should contact the parish office a minimum of six months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparation. At least one member of the couple MUST be in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3-4pm in the Cathedral. Communal Reconciliation services are also held during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

HOSPITAL VISITATION:

When admitted to an area hospital, parishioners should contact the Parish Office in order to receive a pastoral visit, the Sacrament of the Sick, or Holy Communion.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION – Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is held in the Bishop's Daily Mass Chapel every First Friday of the Month following daily 7am Mass until 12 noon.
