Giving God thanks for our many blessings in life is not a job or task of Christians; it is the very essence of our life in Jesus Christ. It should be something so natural to us as breathing. God has created us to be the stewards of this mortal existence. We are only able to do so by rendering him the homage and glory that is due. It is in that act of praising God, that those gifts from God become a blessing upon us. Francis of Assisi had it right when he observed: "It is in giving, that we receive".

Sometimes I wonder if we have that perspective twisted. Do we expect God to give us what we ask? Or, can we really trust that by praising the one who created us in the first place, every need and want we have in life is already provided for us (well before we even dare to

ceaselessly, knowing fully well that God will prompt us to be where we need to be? This thought is nothing new to the believing Church. Consider this thought: Prayer does not change things; prayer changes people and people change things. Joining our voices together in prayer for the Lord's Day provides the impetus to transform our world and our parish. Do keep God at the center this summer. It promises to be awesome!

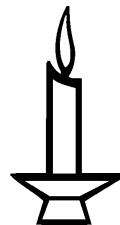

**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:**

Baptisms are celebrated at Rosary Cathedral on the third Sundays of the month at 12:15 p.m. Parents of first-born children are required to attend a one-hour preparation conference before the baptism. Call the parish office at 419-244-9575 for more information and to register for the conference.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:**

Marriages at Rosary Cathedral are celebrated on Fridays at 5pm or 6pm, Saturdays at 10am, 12 noon, and 2pm. Engaged couples should contact the parish office a minimum of six months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparation. At least one member of the couple **MUST** be in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

**SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:**

Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3-4pm in the Cathedral. Communal Reconciliation services are also held during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

**HOSPITAL VISITATION:**
