

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

Somehow God can take the worse possible events and give new hope for a promising future. Given the tide of events involving priests that have transpired of late in our diocese, God has blessed us with four new priests who were ordained at Rosary Cathedral this weekend. Fr. David Cirata, Fr. Jacob Gordon, Fr. Monty Hoyles and Fr. Jeffrey McBeth join the ranks of our diocesan priests to serve the people of God. I have had the pleasure of knowing these four fine priests a number of years. It has been several years since a priestly ordination was held at Rosary Cathedral.

One of the aspects I recall from my years as a seminary educator and supervisor of seminary students was the eagerness that was held deep in the soul of these future priests. They desired to make a difference in the spiritual lives of God's people. One of the important traits I find in these newly ordained priests is their spiritual perspective. Seminaries are trying to foster the most needed ingredient to successful priestly ministry: prayer. The quality of priestly life depends largely on one's personal spiritual life. Coupled with the intellectual and pastoral formation, and balanced people skills, our future priests are pioneering again a waning art. Daily prayer and taking the time for it are the sustenance to the priestly life. The same is true for any believing Christian. I believe our four new priests in the Diocese of Toledo exemplify this spiritual facet and I hope you will join me this weekend in thanking God for their vocation as they begin to serve the Catholic faithful in Northwest Ohio.

On Tuesday, May 30, 2006, a press conference was held at the Catholic Center indicating that Auxiliary Bishop Robert Donnelly's letter of resignation, which every bishop must submit to the Holy Father in Rome on their 75<sup>th</sup> birthday, was accepted by Pope Benedict XVI. Bishop Donnelly has served the Diocese of Toledo very well as Auxiliary Bishop for the past 22 years. We at Rosary Cathedral have not only had the pleasure of knowing Bishop Donnelly as a close friend of the parish as a resident, but in his kind priestly service to the parish as well. He has celebrated the sacraments and Mass for us on weekends and weekdays, provided attention to the indigent and spiritual counsel and direction to many Cathedral parishioners and friends. In the coming weeks, he will be leaving 2544 Parkwood on the Cathedral campus to live at a familiar location in Toledo: Blessed Sacrament Parish Rectory. It is our hope to honor Bishop Donnelly this summer for his years of service to the diocese, and in particular to the Cathedral Parish community at a parish social event. Details will be forthcoming.

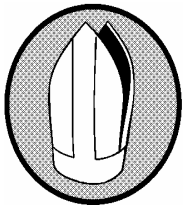
#### First Annual Interfaith Service:

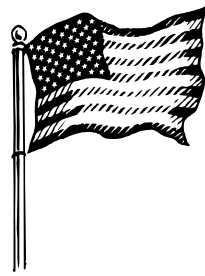

**KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS WORK WITH U.S. BISHOPS TO DEFEND MARRIAGE**

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Knights of Columbus are joining forces in a campaign to encourage U.S. Catholics to write their senators urging a vote in favor of the Marriage Protection Amendment. **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:**

Baptisms are celebrated at Rosary Cathedral on the third Sundays of the month at 12:15 p.m. Parents of first-born children are required to attend a one-hour preparation conference before the baptism. Call the parish office at 419-244-9575 for more information and to register for the conference.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:**

Marriages at Rosary Cathedral are celebrated on Fridays at 5pm or 6pm, Saturdays at 10am, 12 noon, and 2pm. Engaged couples should contact the parish office a minimum of six months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparation. At least one member of the couple MUST be in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

**SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:**

Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3-4pm in the Cathedral. Communal Reconciliation services are also held during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

**HOSPITAL VISITATION:**

When admitted to an area hospital, parishioners should contact the Parish Office in order to receive a pastoral visit, the Sacrament of the Sick, or Holy Communion.

**EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION:** Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is held in the Bishop's Daily Mass Chapel every First Friday of the Month following daily 7am Mass until 12 noon.
