

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

A friend and classmate from high school days relayed to me recently the fact that his oldest son was going to be married in the coming year. Stunned by the fact that the announcement made us both feel tremendously old, he went on to explain that while his son was intending to marry a young lady who was baptized in the Catholic Church, she had drifted for a time and was hoping to come back to the church before the wedding. Her big concern, my classmate shared, was over the issue of the Holy Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in the elements of bread and wine. At that point we looked at each other puzzled. The Eucharist is at the heart of the faith we profess as Roman Catholic Christians. Still, after many centuries of debate, the Eucharist and the devotion and love surrounding are among the traits that make our faith unique to others.

Today, on this feast of the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we are again reminded of this great gift and opportunity in our gathering. Shortly before his passing, Pope John Paul II issued an encyclical letter on the Eucharist with the intent of strengthening the faith of believing Catholics and offering direction to those whose perspective might have been distorted with certain doubts. At the outset of that letter, the late Pope writes: *"The Second Vatican Council rightly proclaimed that the Eucharistic sacrifice is 'the source and summit of the Christian life: for the most holy Eucharist contains the Church's entire spiritual wealth: Christ himself, our Passover and living bread. Through his own flesh, now made living and life-giving by the Holy Spirit, he offers life to men. Consequently, the gaze of the Church is constantly turned to her Lord, present in the Sacrament of the Altar, in which she discovers the full manifestation of his boundless love."* (Art. 1)

We should never take the gift of the Holy Eucharist for granted, but always see it has God's pledge to us of a love that is never ending. Our task this side of heaven is to remain faithful to the truth it holds and radiates.

On this special feast today we also remember with honor all who have been called to the great vocation of fatherhood. Happy Father's Day to all Dad's among us, living and deceased. May your great patron, St. Joseph, always serve to enrich your special role in the family. God bless you all this weekend.

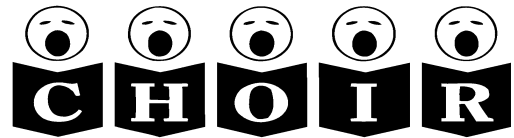
