

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

The recent severe storms endured in the local Toledo area have taken their toll at Rosary Cathedral. After the series of storms which came to our area on Wednesday, June 22<sup>nd</sup>, I was informed by our maintenance staff that the Cathedral boiler room experienced flooding which caused damage to electrical motors to the boilers providing heat to our campus facilities during the winter months. In addition, several pieces of cleaning equipment which assist in maintaining our marble floors in the Cathedral were also destroyed in this brief flood. We have submitted the damage estimates to our insurance carrier.

One of the sobering facts that came to my mind in the course of these events is how people come together in helping others. The local news reporters in the Toledo area where citing the number of people who were assisting stranded motorists whose cars were flooded (and even floating) down residential streets. That action serves as a hopeful sign that while the world in which we live may be cruel and uncaring at times, in moments of real crisis people will come to the aid of those in need.

During the month of July we will be hearing more about our parish partnership program in Louisiana with the people of Holy Family Parish in Dulac. Their pastor, Father Freddie Decal, is coming to Rosary Cathedral the weekend of July 22-23 to preach at all the weekend Masses about the effects of the hurricanes last summer and the rebuilding that has taken place in his faith community. We are very grateful to have him come to Rosary Cathedral in the midst of rebuilding his parish. We will be having a special collection for Holy Family Parish later this month.

As we count our blessings this week with the civil observance of our country's independence, we ask our faithful God to imbue in every heart a loving reverence and awe for the human life entrusted to us. May God be our hope and cause of every joy.

**Health Information from the Parish Nurse Ministry:**

**Insect Safety:** Don't use scented soaps, perfumes or hair sprays on your child. Avoid areas where insects nest or gather, such as pools of stagnant water, uncovered food, or gardens with flowers in bloom. Stay away from clothing with bright colors or flowery prints. To remove a visible stinger from skin, gently scrape it off horizontally with a credit card or your fingernail. Insect repellents containing DEET are the most effective. The maximum concentration now allowed for infants and children is 30%. Avoid using DEET containing products on children under 2 months of age. Read the label on products before you buy them, the concentration of chemicals in them may vary widely. **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:**

Baptisms are celebrated at Rosary Cathedral on the third Sundays of the month at 12:15 p.m. Parents of first-born children are required to attend a one-hour preparation conference before the baptism. Call the parish office at 419-244-9575 for more information and to register for the conference.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:**

Marriages at Rosary Cathedral are celebrated on Fridays at 5pm or 6pm, Saturdays at 10am, 12 noon, and 2pm. Engaged couples should contact the parish office a minimum of six months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparation. At least one member of the couple **MUST** be in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

**SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:**

Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3-4pm in the Cathedral. Communal Reconciliation services are also held during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

**HOSPITAL VISITATION:**

When admitted to an area hospital, parishioners should contact the Parish Office in order to receive a pastoral visit, the Sacrament of the Sick, or Holy Communion.

**EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION:**

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is held in the Bishop's Daily Mass Chapel every First Friday of the Month following daily 7am Mass until 12 noon.
