

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

I received the sad news this past week of a seminary classmate from the Diocese of Youngstown who died of complications from renal cancer. Father Kevin Fete, pastor of Little Flower Parish in Canton, Ohio was one of seventeen men who comprised the freshman class at St. Gregory College Seminary in Cincinnati the fall of 1976. He was one of the types who instigated a few rebellious behaviors in the seminary system often requiring some type of reprimand from seminary administrators. At the same time, I always admired his willingness to keep moving things forward and his dedication to serve others. During our first year of seminary studies we would gather each evening during the week to translate sentences from English to Latin and vice versa. After a two-hour blitz of translating and learning new Latin vocabulary, we would often chat about our hopes of becoming priests.

One significant seminary episode that will always remain in my mind occurred our first year of college seminary. Fr. Fete, who had declared early on that he was going to major in philosophy studies would stay up long hours through the night studying medieval and modern philosophers. When he had come to a point of saturation after reading the biography and contribution of each philosopher, he would find someone to discuss his new-found knowledge to affirm his understanding. One night in particular, many of us on the floor of the student residences were away for some reason, so Fr. Fete decided he would go talk to the professor of the course for clarification. The professor of the philosophy course happened to be the rector of the seminary.

So, donned in his evening attire (summer pajamas!) and slippers, my classmate took his philosophy textbook and went to the door of the rector's office which was located on the main corridor of the seminary facility. "Come in", was the response after knocking on the door. The seminary rector was busy reading and writing as my classmate proceeded to walk to his desk. Immediately, my classmate began to discuss the philosophical method of a particular philosopher as if the conversation had been already taking place. The rector looked up from his desk, placed his pen down and asked: "Do you know where you are standing?" As innocent as Fr. Fete tried to present himself, he responded, "Yeah, I am in your office talking to you." He was told politely to leave and put on appropriate clothing.

Fr. Fete is the first member of our original college seminary class ordained to the priesthood to die. While it has been years since I talked to him, there is

we have known over the years. It is saddening to hear that someone so young who gave so much and made people laugh along the way has been taken from us. Please pray for the repose of his soul and the parishioners of Little Flower Parish in Canton, Ohio that mourn his death. Requiescat in pace!

**What Teenagers Need Most:** Unconditional love allows teens to develop a sense of trust, self-worth, or confidence. They also need space. This allows them the necessary room to grow, to think, to learn, to make mistakes.
