

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

On Tuesday this week, August 15, 2006, Latin Rite Catholics will celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This holy day of obligation is among the oldest feasts honoring the Mother of God. Over the centuries it has known other titles: "Day of Mary Mother of God" in Jerusalem in the mid-fifth century, the "Natale" or "birthday" of Mary's entrance into heaven during the sixth century, and the "Natale Sanctae Mariae" in seventh century Rome. The Latin title can be misleading. It does not refer to Mary's birth into the world (which we commemorate on September 8th each year) but to her birth into heaven. This tradition carries over into the cult of the saints in the Roman Rite Church when most of their feasts are determined not by their earthly birth, but date of their death into heaven.

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the dogmatic teaching on Mary's assumption into heaven. It was then that this feast received the importance it has today. Like other Marian feasts, the Assumption is one of hope and guidance to the Church on earth. It is our fervent prayer that we, like our Blessed Mother, might surrender our will to that of God. We pray that Mary's yes will be our response to the living God. Such an attitude is the way to true Christian adulthood.

Masses will be celebrated at 7:00 AM and 7:00 PM at Rosary Cathedral on Tuesday, August 15, the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Catholic faithful are reminded of the precept to attend Mass on all holy days of obligation.

Please mark your calendars to attend the Cathedral Parish Picnic/Cookout on Saturday, August 26, 2006. Retiring Bishop Robert Donnelly will be the celebrant at the normally scheduled 4:30 PM Mass on August 26 and the honored guest at our annual parish picnic in Msgr. Smith Auditorium following. Bishop Donnelly has faithfully served the diocese, and in particular, Rosary Cathedral Parish for over 20 years. It is only fitting for the parish to express its gratitude to this servant-leader. All food and drinks will be provided by the parish for this annual event. Since CROP Walk started in 1968, CWS uses the funds raised to support self-help developments, meet emergency needs, and help address the root causes of poverty and powerlessness. **CROP Walk will be in Toledo on Sunday, October 8, 2006 from 1:30 to 4:00 p.m.** at two sites to participate at: Ottawa Park Shelter for congregations west of the Maumee River and Pearson Park Tennis Court Shelter for congregations east of the river. Health Information from the Parish Nurse Ministry:

Tips for easing into a new school routine: Assure your child that being anxious, nervous, or excited about school are normal feelings. Attend orientation with your child and tour the school. Show the child where the bus will drop them off, and how to get to their classroom. Speak to the school nurse, teachers, and administrators about any medical conditions and medication needs your child will have. Plan what the child should do in any emergency situation, such as if you are late picking them up, or what to do if nobody is home when they arrive. Be consistent with end of the day arrangements so your child can trust and depend on his expectations. Start a practice of a healthy breakfast and packed lunch.
