

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

Since July, we have been asking your daily prayers for Father Bernie Boff who has been convalescing at the Ursuline Center on Indian Road after a double-knee replacement surgery. Father Boff has been residing at the Bishop's Residence and a visible presence at Rosary Cathedral since he was granted senior status in 2003. He has been a great help to our parish community, assisting with daily Masses during the week and an occasional liturgy on weekends, in addition to hearing confessions during the Advent and Lenten seasons. It was his personal desire to return to the residence at 2544 Parkwood once the period of physical therapy was completed under the watchful care of the medical staff at the Ursuline Center. Sometimes, the plan we ourselves hope to follow can take a totally different direction. That seems to be the case for Fr. Boff and all of us at Rosary Cathedral.

Most recently, Father William Kubacki, Vicar for Priests, announced that Fr. Boff would be making the Ursuline Center his permanent home and will not return to the residence at 2544 Parkwood Avenue. This decision has evoked a bitter-sweet emotion in my heart. Fr. Boff has been a personal inspiration to me for many years because of his love for the poor and the care he himself extended to enrich their lives over the years. I remember as a young seminarian serving a summer internship in Toledo's inner city in 1982. Fr. Boff, the late Frs. Ron Kurth and Arch Thomas who were also serving in central city parishes at the time, joined forces together and designed a ten-week ministry immersion experience for 4 Toledo diocesan seminarians. Fr. Boff was the head supervisor. I remember him taking great interest in the young seminarians who were eager to change the face of poverty in Toledo all in ten weeks time! We often retold stories of that summer at our dining room table after I became rector of the Cathedral parish. I have always appreciated his perspective on life experiences and awed by his charity and kindness.

I have felt his absence in the Bishop's residence since his hospital stay and subsequent convalescence at the Ursuline Center. His departure from the Cathedral campus is saddening, yet I know in my heart that the personal care he has and will continue to receive from the Ursuline Sisters will be the very best for him. Please join me in thanking this priest-servant who has shared his spiritual wisdom and love of God with us at Rosary Cathedral. I am sure that if any parishioners were to stop by the Ursuline Center to visit Fr. Bernie, he would enjoy seeing you. For those who would like to send him

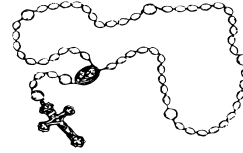

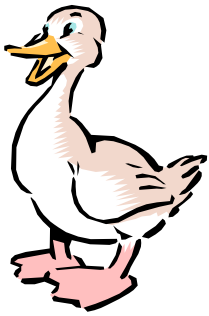

PARISH REGISTRATION:

Please notify the Parish Office at 419-244-9575 when you have a telephone number and/or address change so we can keep our records current. New members are always welcome and can register in person or by calling the Parish Office.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are celebrated at Rosary Cathedral on the third Sundays of the month at 12:15 p.m. Parents of first-born children are required to attend a one-hour preparation conference before the baptism. Call the parish office at 419-244-9575 for more information and to register for the conference.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Marriages at Rosary Cathedral are celebrated on Fridays at 5pm or 6pm, Saturdays at 10am, 12 noon, and 2pm. Engaged couples should contact the parish office a minimum of six months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparation. At least one member of the couple MUST be in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3-4pm in the Cathedral. Communal Reconciliation services are also held during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

HOSPITAL VISITATION:

When admitted to an area hospital, parishioners should contact the Parish Office in order to receive a pastoral visit, the Sacrament of the Sick or Holy Communion.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION:

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is held in the Bishop's Daily Mass Chapel every First Friday of the Month following daily 7am Mass until 12 noon.
