

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

As we make our way deeper into the season of fall these days of October, I am reminded of the activities that involve a number of people at Rosary Cathedral. Many parishes at this time of year recruit their members to various service activities that bring vibrancy to the community. At Rosary Cathedral these next weekends during the month of October we will be soliciting the involvement of our members to join one or several of these service ministries in our parish. Sign up sheets for these multiple activities will be available on the tables provided on the parking lot side of the Cathedral. We need your involvement at Rosary Cathedral!

Perhaps your time and talent or skill shared with the parish might express itself in one of our weekend liturgical ministries. We are in need of people in our parish who can serve as lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, or are willing to sing in either our parish folk group (9AM Mass) or adult choir (11AM Mass). We are in need of enlisting the assistance of members from the parish ranging in age from third grade to senior status to become altar servers. Perhaps your skill and talent shared with the parish might be to serve as a Cathedral usher welcoming those who come for Masses. Maybe you would like to help with efforts of hospitality following each of our Sunday liturgies with refreshments.

Beyond the Sunday liturgy, our parish could use the assistance of members in a growing homebound ministry by visiting those Cathedral parishioners who are not able to be with us for Mass on Sundays. You might have a desire to support our parish ministry to the neighborhood nursing care facilities by attending a monthly Mass with the residents, or to take Holy Communion to those who can not attend Mass due to their limited mobility.

Our parish outreach ministries might be another aspect of parish life that might interest those who want to work with the poor. Our local St. Vincent de Paul Society conference is looking for more members to join their organization in service to the poor. You might want to assist a coordinating team of parishioners with the annual Thanksgiving Food Collection, the Advent Giving Tree ministry or the Free Easter Dinner at Rosary Cathedral begun by the late Deacon Bill Keran. When a parishioner dies, many will offer their service to the parish by preparing a casserole or will be on hand to serve at a funeral luncheon. These activities can only happen with the involvement and able leadership of our members.

the administrative tasks of the parish, we can use the volunteer assistance of our members with such things as parish mailings and leading a tour of the Cathedral during the week.

One of our newest efforts at Rosary Cathedral is the Cathedral Gold Club, a social group comprised of members 50 years and over that gathers on the second Thursday of the month for a luncheon and activity. You might find this social gathering enriching.

These few activities are integral to our parish life and its vitality. Please think of your membership at Rosary Cathedral and the ways that membership contributes to the vibrancy of the parish. We need you. We need each other to make things happen.

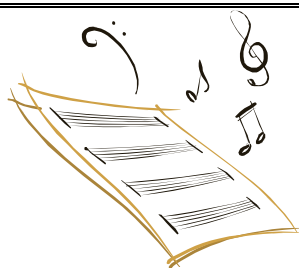

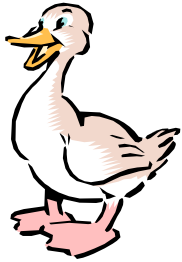

PARISH REGISTRATION:

Please notify the Parish Office at 419-244-9575 when you have a telephone number and/or address change so we can keep our records current. New members are always welcome and can register in person or by calling the Parish Office.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are celebrated at Rosary Cathedral on the third Sundays of the month at 12:15 p.m. Parents of first-born children are required to attend a one-hour preparation conference before the baptism. Call the parish office at 419-244-9575 for more information and to register for the conference.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Marriages at Rosary Cathedral are celebrated on Fridays at 5pm or 6pm, Saturdays at 10am, 12 noon, and 2pm. Engaged couples should contact the parish office a minimum of six months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparation. At least one member of the couple MUST be in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3-4pm in the Cathedral. Communal Reconciliation services are also held during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

HOSPITAL VISITATION:

When admitted to an area hospital, parishioners should contact the Parish Office in order to receive a pastoral visit, the Sacrament of the Sick or Holy Communion.
