

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

This Wednesday, November 1, is the solemn feast of All Saints. This holy day of obligation will be celebrated at Rosary Cathedral at three Masses: 7:00 AM, 8:35 AM and 7:00 P.M. this year. Those who wish to celebrate the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day) on Thursday, November 2 will want to attend any one of three liturgies that have been planned at Resurrection, Calvary and Mt. Carmel Cemeteries in Toledo. Further information on these special Masses is printed on the flyer inserted with this bulletin.

November also signals two significant parish customs at Rosary Cathedral that connect us in faith with heaven and the world in which we live. During the month of November, our parish Book of the Faithful Departed will be placed in the lower sanctuary area near the parking lot entrance to inscribe the names of our relatives, friends and fellow parishioners who have died at any time. Please feel free to inscribe the names of your loved ones who have died. In particular, we recall the memory of those who were called to the Lord this past year. The burning Paschal Candle near the Book of Faithful Departed reminds us of the perpetual light of Christ and the prayer of the entire Church which keeps the memory of our loved ones close to the heart. The Book of the Faithful Departed will remain in the lower sanctuary until the First Sunday of Advent.

Next weekend and during the entire month of November until Thanksgiving Day, we will be accepting your canned and non-perishable food items for our Annual Cathedral Thanksgiving Food collection. These items are dispersed during the Christmas holidays and throughout the winter season to those who seek assistance from the Cathedral Conference of the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. In addition to canned food items and dry goods, we will also accept any toiletries and personal hygiene products (bar soap, toothpaste, shampoo, dish soap). All items collected this year will be placed in the lower sanctuary area underneath the high pulpit (Islington side) as has been our custom. Last year, I recall someone observing that if we stacked all of the food collected for this drive, it would have exceeded well over the canopy above the pulpit. That's a lot of food! I believe we can achieve that same goal this year. Thank you in advance for your participation in this annual parish effort.

Finally and returning to the topic that opened my column this weekend, I hope that you will entrust to your prayers these days of November all of those who

gratitude and love our Cathedral parishioners who have died this past year and their families that mourn their loss these days. Our funeral rite in the Catholic Church says it most aptly: "*Merciful Lord, turn toward us and listen to our prayers: open the gates of paradise to your servants and help us who remain to comfort one another with assurances of faith, until we all meet in Christ and are with you and with our brothers and sisters for ever*".
