May God bless each American citizen who casts a vote this year that they will look clearly and honestly at the heart of every issue and allow the values which promote our life on earth to guide their decisions.

The Toledo Diocesan Choir will present the *Requiem* by Maurice Duruflé on Sunday, November 12, 2006, at 3:00 P.M. in the Cathedral. The program will also include *Sing Me to Heaven* by Daniel Gawthrop, *When I Survey the Wondrous Cross* by Gilbert Martin, *Hear My Prayer* by Moses Hogan, *Come My Way, My Truth, My Life* by Paul French and a congregational hymn, *I Know That My Redeemer Lives*. Vocal soloists from the choir are Anne Corrigan, Jeff Wisniewski and Wendy Wisniewski. The choir will be accompanied by organist Mark Koehl. There is no admission charge for this concert. The Toledo Diocesan Choir is composed of choral singers and directors drawn from parishes in the diocese. Their primary focus is to provide music for Diocesan Pontifical liturgies at Our Lady, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary Cathedral. Their liturgical repertoire reflects the diversity of cultures found in the Diocese of Toledo as well as the traditional music of the Catholic liturgy. The choir also presents occasional concerts at the cathedral.
