

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Rosary Cathedral:

Since mid-September, our parish has been actively involved in a fundraising effort to replenish monies from our savings that were used to pay for the recently installed south entrance (new parking lot side) of Msgr. Smith Auditorium. This completed project cost the parish \$130,000.00. As of this weekend, a number of our members have stepped forward at my invitation to help offset this financial challenge. I am pleased to announce that since this first phase of the capital campaign began in September, approximately 27 households in Rosary Cathedral Parish have generated a financial pledge-gift totaling \$70,000 for this capital campaign.

The time has come to activate the second phase, a parish-wide effort, to acquire the remaining funds for our total goal. Sixty-thousand (\$60,000) dollars remains to arrive at our target goal of \$130,000. I am confident that we can reach the total amount, but it will require a measured level of patience, time and sacrifice on the part of our entire membership.

In the coming week, a letter and pledge card will be sent to all registered households in the parish that have not had the opportunity to contribute to this campaign. No gift is too large or small for this parish-wide effort. We are accepting cash and pledge donations at various contributing levels. For those who would prefer to pledge a gift over a period of time (one or two years) and wish to receive monthly, quarterly, or annual reminders from the parish, arrangements can be made for this option.

The important aspect to this whole effort is the involvement of the entire parish. No one person or group of persons should carry the entire challenge alone. Some people will be able to give more than others. It is the involvement of many people, giving what they can, that makes the investment our own. When people work together on a project, they can do the unthinkable. I believe this capital campaign gives us the opportunity to thank God for everything we have as Catholic Christians and as parishioners of Rosary Cathedral. Your gift to this campaign is looking forward to the future generations of Cathedral parishioners and friends who will benefit from the investment we are making now.

As I conveyed in last weekend's bulletin, monies from our parish savings and not the weekly Sunday collection were used to fund the recent south entrance project to Msgr. Smith Auditorium. Both the savings we hold in reserve and the weekly Sunday collection which covers our monthly parish expenditures are two independent accounts.

I thank you in advance for your consideration and your possible gift to the 2007 Rosary Cathedral Parish Capital Campaign.

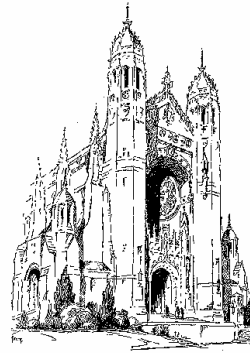
